AREA 364 Square Miles.

POPULATION 13,000; White 8,500, Colored 4,500.

DURHAM COUNTY was formed in 1881, from parts of Orange and Wake counties, and takes its name from the principal town and county-seat, formerly known as "Durham Depot," on the North Carolina Railroad, and which took its name from the Durham family residing at that place.

DURHAM, the county-seat, is known as one of the most flourishing and enterprising towns in the State, having risen, since the war, from a mere hamlet of half a dozen houses, to its present dimensions of some 4,500 inhabitants (3,000 in corporation), and is the headquarters of the world-renowned "Durham Smoking Tobacco," besides many other important enterprises. It is 26 miles north of west from Raleigh.

Surface, moderately undulating; water-power good; climate healthy.

Staples—Corn, wheat, cotton, oats, rye, tobacco and vegetables.

Fruits—Apples, peaches, pears, plums, damsons, berries, &c.

Timbers—All the hard woods, pine and cedar, poplar, &c., &c.
